**After John Hart, delegate from New Jersey, signed the Declaration of Independence, British soldiers pursued him. He left his wife on her sickbed and went into hiding. When he returned, his farm was destroyed, his wife had died and his children were scattered. *Talk about how we now show our own dedication to freedom. As a class, plan a time to make posters and encourage voter participation in the upcoming election.*

**Have students talk to their parents about the causes to which they are dedicated. Have the students report, then combine and graph the answers.

**Play Virus Ball: Divide the group into two teams. Each team must stay on his half of the gym. Balls are placed in the middle of the gym. At the blow of the whistle, all try to keep the balls (virus) out of their area. After about 45 seconds, the whistle is blown again. Play stops. The winner is the side with the least virus balls. Play this again, only have a few people on one side quit 10 seconds before the last whistle.⁷ *What does being dedicated have to do with winning a game?* Said John Wooten, "It's not so important who starts the game but who finishes it."⁸

Bruce and the Spider

Hundreds of years ago Robert the Bruce was the king of Scotland. The King of England invaded his land with the intent to make Scotland a part of England.

The deafness made it difficult to perform her floor routines that are choreographed to music. Her blindness made the balancing beam challenging. Yet, Aimee was two steps away from qualifying for the USA Championships. Sometimes being able to communicate only with sign language was advantageous. At 15, Aimee was invited to be America's lone representative to Kazkstan in the old Soviet Union. No one else spoke English, yet she managed to "talk" with people. When asked if she would give up gymnastics to have her sight and hearing, she surprised her mother with a "No" answer. "Because gymnastics has brought so much to her life," said her mother.¹⁰ *What does dedication have to do with overcoming obstacles to achieve success?*

A basketball game sounds so inviting. *If Sam is truly dedicated to his goal of achieving top marks, what should he do?*
